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PACKING FOR YOUR RIVER TRIP

PERSONAL ITEMS

Water Bottle (16-32oz)	Baby wipes	Small Towel
Toothbrush	Biodegradable Soap	Feminine Hygiene Products
Toothpaste	Hand Sanitizer	Small Packs of Tissue
Medications	Comb/brush	Deodorant
Lip Balm w/spf	Lotion/After sun care	Insect Repellant

Sunscreen (SPF 15-30 lotion less than a year old is best, please DO NOT bring spray sunscreen)

CLOTHES

Swimsuit(s)	Underwear	Shoes for Rafting (any kind of sandals are fine)
Long Pants (for sun)	1-2 Short Sleeve Shirt	Shoes for Camp
Socks	Hat	Light-weight long sleeved shirt or rashguard for on the river sun protection
1-2 Shorts for in camp	Rain Poncho	Sweatshirt or light jacket if early summer trip
Bandana	Sunglasses	
Shorts for on the river (required to be worn while sitting on the raft to prevent slipping off)		

CAMPING GEAR

Sleeping Bag	Small Pillow	Pad or Cot (no hammocks are allowed in camp)
TENT	Tarp or Ground Cloth	Flat sheet for sleeping when weather is warm
Flashlight		

DO LEAVE AT HOME (or at least in the car)

Cell phones (coverage is limited on the river)	Expensive Jewelry
Electronics or other gaming devices	Excessive Amounts of Clothing
Expensive Cameras (Go Pros are good but be sure to have a safety strap and float)	

NOTES:

- 1. A 16 oz cup will be provided for use in camp. Please bring a water bottle for on the river. A gear bag will be on each raft to keep them organized,**
2. Your gear will not be with you during the day while on the river. If there are medications you will need, please bring a small dry bag or we have some available to use while on the river.
3. Any personal items that are left in Moab after the river trip will be disposed of if not claimed within ten days. **We suggest that you mark every item with your name, address, and group and use colored duct tape or string to identify the bags in your group.**
4. We suggest that you bring a change of clothing to leave in your vehicle to change into for your trip home. Put them in a plastic bag. At the end of the trip you can use that plastic bag to hold your wet clothing.
5. **There are no shower facilities either on the river or at the warehouse for you to use.**
6. Please pack your personal items in soft bags such as a duffel or a laundry bag. DO NOT use hard suitcases. Pack any items that might break between soft materials. Anything that could spill should be in plastic bags. Bags are tossed in and out of a truck each day, so there is always the possibility of breakage. Do not tie bags together as it makes it difficult to load and unload. 5 gallon buckets are acceptable containers for personal items.
7. We apologize, but due to space constraints on most trips, camp chairs are not on the list. A few chairs for adults may be brought, but not enough for each person to have one. Picnic tables are available at most of the campsites we use, or you can bring tarps for the group to not sit in the dirt. Buckets are an ok way to pack your personal items if you already have them and double as a chair. If you are meeting us at your campsite and we are not moving your gear you are welcome to bring anything you would like, including a chair for everyone.
